# President's Message

You might notice the newsletter is a little early this month. That's because, thanks to a scheduling conflict with the Garden, our annual repotting meeting which usually falls on the first Monday of April will instead fall on the last Monday of March—the 27th to be exact. So, I hope everybody got all the info on soils, pot preparation, and finding the front of your trees so that we can bring it all together at the meeting. March looks to be a cold month this year, despite the pleasantly warm February we had, so it is not yet time to take those trees completely out of winter storage. It is, however, a good time to pull those wires that are getting close to biting. The trees will start their spring growth spurt shortly and those wires will bite fast and hard if we're not ready for it.

Looking ahead to the May meeting—we've taken some of your feedback to plan the menu. A lot of people asked about the care of conifers, so we've taken the opportunity to have Phil Malhoit present a program comparing and contrasting the care of Pines (the experienced level plant) versus Juni-

pers (the beginners plant). Bring your notebooks. Also in May will be our annual spring exhibit. Posters and signage are ready, and will be available at the general meetings. Also available is the volunteer signup sheet, and while the May Exhibition is not as intensive in its staffing requirements, many hands make light work. Finally don't forget to check out and register for the workshops available at the show on the Society website: MidwestBonsai. org. The workshops this year are geared toward beginner and intermediate students and are a good way to acquire trees and some in-depth knowledge about their care in one place.

In other news, we've gained a candidate for Public Relations Officer, and we are very grateful to have his interest. Sadly, however, our Vice President of Programs has decided to vacate the position for personal reasons. I'm going to take this opportunity to thank him for his service. He has been a worthy asset to the Society. Thank you for your time and effort, Victor.

There are no hard qualifications for the position, but there are several skills that would be useful. The first would be good contacts in the Bonsai community at large. Having experience teaching or forming a lesson plan will make it easier to put together a targeted series of programs for the year. Another very useful skill to have would be the rarest—public speaking. If you have any or all of these, fantastic. we'd love to hear from you.

If you don't, apply anyway, because the most necessary thing to have is a willing heart.



# **Monthly Care Report:** What to Do in the End of March and into April

When the temperature is consistently 65 degrees and sunny you can bring your trees out of their winter storage area. Get started repotting your deciduous trees. Junipers are OK to do, and pines can be started any time during the month. Continue to provide good after-care, by protecting repotted trees


from frosts, which will still happen in April.


You can begin fertilizing trees repotted in April. Keep your initial fertilizer mix on the light side for those first couple doses of fertilizer. April is still a decent month for root-pruning, and for digging trees from yard or field. Begin your feeding, pinching, watering, and pruning schedules in earnest. Of course, be mindful of potential cold snaps, and be ready to protect vulnerable plants.

Tropical trees will be showing new growth, even under lights. Cuttings will be easier to root now that the days are lengthening. Use a rooting hormone as an aid. As always, keep

a close watch for insects. which may show up fast as the weather warms. As April gets closer you may want to start some plants from seeds.
