President's Message

News, news, news, news. April is full of news for the Society. Starting with the **April General Meeting,** we have a headliner all the way from the west coast. Austin Heitzman, craftsman of fine furnishings and some of the most avant garde bonsai stands today (see his work at www.austinheitzmanfurniture.com) will be talking to us about stands and displays. Austin's works have supported numerous prizewinning displays across the U.S. from the Artisans Cup on the west coast to the U.S. National Bonsai Exhibition near Rochester, New York, to our own Mid-America Bonsai Exhibition, Austin works closely with Ryan Neil of Bonsai Mirai to craft stands that evoke the spirit of the tree for which they are designed. It should be a very interesting talk. Join us April 2nd in the Bernstein Room at the Chicago Botanic Gardens.

April will also see the debut of the Society's new multimedia projector. After almost 3 years of debate and study, the Society has acquired a projector unit with brighter, more colorful, and far more detailed images. The new projector will pair with the handheld camera acquired last year

to allow us to get close in to the action during critiques and demonstrations, some of you may remember a few meetings in the last couple of years where we experimented with the live camera and we had a lot of positive feedback from the attempts. It is our hope in the future to be able to online for those who can't attend the meetings in person for various reasons.

Late April should see temperatures stabilize enough to bring out our trees and start working on them for the May Exhibition just five weeks after our April meeting on May 11th, 12th, and 13th. I look forward to seeing your trees and the creative displays you're planning. Watch your E-mail for the list of open volunteer positions, we have a lot of holes to fill yet. We especially need **Docent** volunteers to interact with the public and provide watchful eyes for our trees. We seem to have an especially hard time getting volunteers on Sunday mornings, so if you are able to fill in at that time, it would be most appreciated.

The end of the May Exhibit will start our 3 month

countdown to the 41st Annual Mid-America Bonsai Exhibit. It really seemed like the show was years away in January, but my how the time flies. Our Guest Judge, Naoki Maeoka, (my apologies if I didn't get that spelled correctly) is coming direct from Japan this year, keep that in mind while you prepare your displays.

Two new books are available in the library. The well-recommended "Bonsai Survival Guide" by Colin Lewis, and "Tropical Green Sheets 2" by Martha Goff. Both are packed with horticultural information on bonsai species. Mr. Lewis' book focuses on commonly used species, while "Tropical Green Sheets 2" has a number of rarer species listed along with a plethora of other information ranging from using sphagnum moss to soil sifting and repotting to a year-long lead up for preparing exhibit trees. Both these books should

be useful for beginner and experienced hands alike and I think they are a good addition to the stacks.

Intermediate classes are still in session with Ivan Watters. Saturday afternoons at B.C. Bonsai have a limited number of 5 seats available due to limited parking conditions. So call ahead to reserve your seat. Sunday mornings see him instructing at the residence of Brendan Barry in Lake Forest. There are more seats available Sunday, but again, call ahead to be sure of a seat. B.C. Bonsai are also holding harvesting workshops at their Paw Paw, Illinois grow fields on March 31st, April 1st, April 7th, and April 8th. Cost starts at \$20 and may go up depending on the tree you choose. For more details call B.C. Bonsai.

Monthly Care Report:

What to Do in April

When the temperature is consistently 65 degrees and sunny you can bring your trees out of their winter storage area. Get started repotting your deciduous trees. Junipers are OK to do, and pines can be started any time during the month. Continue to provide good after-care, by protecting repotted trees from frosts, which will still happen in April.

You can begin fertilizing trees repotted in April. Keep your initial fertilizer mix on the light side for those first couple doses of fertilizer. April is still a decent month for root-pruning, and for digging trees from yard or field. Begin your feeding, pinch-

ing, watering, and pruning schedules in earnest. Of course, be mindful of potential cold snaps, and be ready to protect vulnerable plants.

Tropical trees will be showing new growth, even under lights. Cuttings will be easier to root now that the days are lengthening. Use a rooting hormone as an aid. As always, keep a close watch for insects, which may show up fast as the weather warms. In April you may want to start some plants from seeds.
