June is almost done, the heat has settled in for the summer, and the August show is looming large on the horizon. Do you have a tree in mind to show yet? If you don't, all is not lost yet. Maybe you have one that you think is close to ready. Yeah, that one that's just a little scraggly around the edges and needs a little TLC to get it ready to go? We are hoping to have the new cards printed, filled out and mailed to you in time for the August Exhibition. In other news, our Milwaukee friends have finally finished their permanent exhibit at the Lynden Sculpture Garden in Milwaukee Wisconsin. Monthly Care Report: What to Do in July

July, hot and humid as it is, is a great time of year for bonsai. Growth has slowed, deciduous trees are leafed out, and juniper trees should be bushy. Since it is also vacation time, be sure to plan ahead, even if leaving for a few days. Find a trusty friend or hook up a watering system with a timer.

Keep your trees in shape by pinching or light pruning. Check wiring on trees. Watch for pests and diseases, and spray accordingly. If you find something wrong and aren't sure what the problem is, consult someone who is knowledgeable, and ask them. Watch out for scale, looking for tiny white specks on the foliage. Scale requires repeated sprayings regularly, as it is amazingly persistent. Fertilize regularly. If using fertilizer cakes, replace every month.

Turn your trees often so that all sides get equal amounts of sunlight and grow in all directions. The hot sun can heat up pots and the soil, trees in widerimmed pots tend to get hotter, and deep pots retain more heat than shallow ones. To prevent heat damage to roots cover soil and the rims of your pots with old cloth or burlap. This will also help keep the plants moist longer.
