President's Message

Greetings once again fellow members.

October is rapidly approaching and temps are promising to plunge into the 40s any day now. If you have "tropical" or "indoor" plants its past time to prep your winter storage areas and more like time to preemptively bring those delicate plants in to the nest. It's also time to begin treating your hardies for their winter storage. Thoroughly treat them for pests and disease as it is very easy to transfer these things plant to plant in the close confines of a winter box or a small hoop house. Remember to vary your active ingredients and pay attention to your plants tolerances to those ingredients. Our program this month on October 7th will be wintering your trees. Yes, it's a refresher for

most, but it is an essential skill for anyone new to the hobby. The meeting will be in Burnstein Hall as usual. As this is a basic skill, and we have board elections coming up in November, bonsai 101 will be deferred in favor of a "State of the Society" statement along with a Q&A segment.

On the matter of Board elections, I think it is necessary that I make the point that all Board positions (with the exception of Immediate Past President) are contestable. Meaning that any member of the Society may run for any of the positions whether they are occupied or vacant. With that said, I want to emphasize that there are a great many positions opening up this year and that without persons willing and able to give some time to the Society, the

Society will be in difficult straights next year. Positions currently vacating or already vacant and without candidates to fill the roles include President, Executive Vice President, Vice President of Monthly Programming, and Membership Secretary. I hope you will give some thought to sustaining the Society by contributing a little of your time each month to ensure its continued operation. Elections will be held by secret ballot at the November 4th Society meeting.

On the matter of smooth operations, we have encountered a problem with the Membership records. For the last few years we have used features of the Yahoo Email account to track membership periods and renewal dates. We are not certain when the change was effected,

however, some time in late August or early September, Yahoo saw fit to completely change the Email interface. Removing or limiting access to features like sorted contact lists and many of the detailed information fields we were using to track the membership. We have been able to recover much of the data, but there has been some loss that will require a lot of digging to recover. Ironically data for those who chose to renew their membership through Paypal and Eventbrite will be easiest to recover, if you have the option of using these services in the future I highly suggest doing so. Please bear with us as we sort through the data and establish a new database.

Monthly Care Report: What to Do in October

Fall is here! This is a great time to work on evergreen trees, particularly junipers and 5-needle pines. Remove yellowing needles from pines, and crispy leaves from deciduous trees. Keep a close eye on exposure to sunlight as the sun continues to move south in the sky, as warm pots can dry out quickly.

Tree functions change significantly toward the latter part of October. In fall, photosynthesis slows down, deciduous trees "wall-off" the leaves at the petiole, and as a result

For further information or to sign up go to www.milwaukeebonsai.org/docs/YC/Exhibit_Folk-Fair_Flyer.pdf leaves begin to turn colors, and the trees prepare themselves for winter by continually moving accumulated energy stores down into the roots. As this happens, deciduous trees become less and less active on top. until winter is here and it becomes safe to work on the top by wiring and light pruning. Roots will remain active for the next several weeks, so proper watering is important. The stronger they are, going into winter, the stronger they'll emerge in the spring. Remember, healthy growth is the canvass for our art.

Continue feeding through October, using feeds with higher Phosphorus and Potassium. These are the 2nd and 3rd values on fertilizer labels. For example: at our meetings BC Bonsai will have "Dyna-Gro Mag-Pro" with N-P-K values of 2-15-4, where Nitrogen is 2% by weight of total content, Phosphorus is 15% by weight of total content, and Potassium is 4% by weight of total content. Phosphorus is associated with blooms and root growth. Potassium is associated with root growth and disease resistance.

Cool nights and higher humidity can lead to fungal problems. Watch the soil surface, backside of trunks, and understory leaves and take action if any fungal problems are identified.
